Internet remains suspended in Srinagar, seven other districts

All prepaid mobile connections and 2G mobile Internet services were restored in parts of Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday, even as the authorities' bid to provide limited access Internet has hit the 'whitelist' wall after poor speeds in four districts of Jammu made websites inaccessible

"Voice and short messaging service (SMS) facility on all local prepaid SIM cards across J&K shall be restored on Saturday. 2G mobile data services on the post-paid mobiles for accessing whitelisted sites shall be allowed in all 10 districts of Jammu division, besides Kupwara and Bandipora districts of the Kashmir Valley," Principal Secretary, Planning, and

#### Two convicted for 2013 rape of Delhi minor

A special court in Delhi on Saturday convicted two men of raping a five-yearold girl at Gandhi Nagar in East Delhi in 2013, observing that the victim had experienced exceptional depravity and extreme brutality at their hands. Arguments on the quantum of sentence will be heard on

January 30. Stating that the case had shaken the collective conscience of society, Additional sessions judge Naresh Kumar Malhotra of the Karkardooma court held Manoj Shah and Pradeep Kumar guilty.

The gruesome incident, which had triggered widespread protests, took place on April 15, 2013. Police said the two men were inebriated when Shah lured the girl into his room. They then subjected her to unnatural sex and also attempted to

strangle her, as alleged. The missing victim was located after about 40 hours in a room on the ground floor of the same building where her family lived on the first floor.

The police seized three candles and a hair-oil bottle that were inserted inside the girl.

NEW DELHI The Environment Ministry has exempted oil and gas firms, looking to conduct exploratory drilling, from seekenvironmental clea-

rance. The clearance is for both on-shore and offshore drilling explorations and the process is an ecologically-intensive exercise that involves digging multiple wells and conducting seismic surveys offshore.

# A decade-long drive for road safety

and the driver could not see

Kuldeep Janghu has put reflector tapes on 5 lakh vehicles

Moved by the death of a man in a road accident 10 years ago, Kuldeep Janghu took it upon himself to do "his bit" to prevent the loss of lives in accidents due to poor visibility. A decade later, the gener-

al secretary of Maruti Udyog Kamgaar Union, running a singular campaign against road accidents due to fog in winter, has fixed reflector tapes on around five lakh motorised and non-motorised vehicles, including bicycles and rickshaws.

"It was a foggy morning

a tree almost in the middle of the road. The car hit the tree and the driver and three occupants sustained serious injuries. The driver died after three days and the others remained hospitalised for months," said Mr. Janghu, recounting the accident that prompted him to prevent such "avoidable" tragedies. He decided to put reflector tapes on vehicles, trees, boulders and electric poles on the roadsides to prevent

accidents due to poor visibility. "To begin with, I bought a 50-metre-long reflector

and friends have contributed to my campaign time and again. My company has also helped me on a couple of occasions. But I bear the maximum expenditure," he said. Claiming that he had covered around one lakh vehicles this season alone, Mr. Janghu said he would also fix the reflector tapes on the central verge and sharp and blind turns.
