Virus locks down 4cr in China

Wuhan, China, Jan. 24: Chinese authorities rapidly expanded a mammoth quarantine effort aimed at containing a deadly contagion on Friday as nervous residents were checked for fevers.

The number of confirmed cases rose to 830. Twenty-six people have died, including the first two deaths outside Hubei. While the World Health Organization (WHO) held off on declaring a global emergency despite con-firmed cases in half a dozen other countries, China extended its lockdown to 13 cities and a staggering 41 million people — greater than the population of Canada.

South Korea and Japan both detected their second cases, and Singapore two more for a total of three. In the US, a second case of China virus has been found, while 50 are under investigation.

The first city closed off was Wuhan, with 11 million people, or 1.5 times the population of New York City. It is the indus-trial hub of central China. Access was cut off later to neighbouring cities in the central province of Hubei that include Huanggang, with seven million people; Ezhou; Chibi; Qianjiang; Zhijiang; Jingmen; Xiantao; Xiaogan and Huan-

1st sample from city is negative

A student from the city, who had returned from a medical college in Kuhan, tested negative for the deadly new coronavirus strain that has spread to many countries from China.

The student's sample was sent to the National Institute of Virology (NIV), Pune, for testing on Wednesday. The negative report was received on Friday, an official from the health department told Decean told

Chronicle.

Despite the negative report, the student continues to be in a govern-ment hospital under officials observation, said.

The student is doing his MBBS in a college in Wuhan, officials said. After he developed fever symptoms, and given his recent travel history, he was admitted in the government hospital and his samples taken by road.

Experts say that its spread is largely local. "The history of coronavirus shows it will multiply in human bodies and spread faster," said Dr Subakar Kandi, sprior cheet specialist senior chest specialist.

According to them, coronavirus spreads when the human body sheds the virus during coughing, breathing heavily or sneezing. human to human transmission.

It also spreads when a person coughs and sneezes on the surface around them. Touching that same surface allows the virus to enter the body. After touching an infected site, hands are used to eat, drink water or simply rubbing one's body, which gives the virus a gateway to the body.

Hydroponic farming helps grow leafy vegetables easily

HYDERABAD, JAN. 24

Hydroponic farming has made it much easier to farm greens like lettuce, spinach, Swiss chard, and kale, herbs like basil, parsley, oregano, cilantro, and tomatoes. These are organic and natural, don't need soil and grow fast. They are not prone to diseases much, are affordable and yield very well.

Growing hydroponic gardens has become a new trend in the past few months. Hydroponics, the plants without the use of soil, uses specific water delivery processes to deliver nutrients directly to the roots.

Traditional agriculture farming uses around 80 per cent of surface and groundwater compared to hydroponics, which uses only 10 per cent of that under controlled conditions. Water keeps circulating within the system allowing plants to absorb the necessary water for active metabolism, while surplus water moves to the reservoir or storage tank to be cycled. There is no leaching, harmful runoff and there is little evaporation of water.

This type of system can

be installed at a place where the source water is not fit for growing agriculture crops or there is limited supply of water for general farming. An added benefit is the enhanced production capacity of the hydroponic indoor garden system with limited resources.

"For people who look for nontoxic, chemical free organic vegetables, greens and fruits, this one is the best ways of achieving a healthier lifestyle," says Mr Dinesh Madaram, a bonsai designer.

Over 10 acres in Hussainsagar FTL encroached: Activist

An environmentalist has alleged the encroachment of 10 acres of the full tank level (FTL) of Hussainsagar on the Necklace side, along the Kukatpally nala. encroachers have laid roads and barricaded the area, which is invisible from the ground level but can be seen in satellite

Ms Lubna Sarwath, cofounder, Save Our Urban Lakes (SOUL), said she had conducted a field level survey on January 19 and found that the encroachment was within the FTL. She said that the encroachments were veri-

fied with documents from the Catchment Area Development office at Secunderabad. "Plotting has been done, tar roads laid, barricades have been put up and con-struction is going on," Ms Sarwath said, providing the geographical locations of 17.437191, 78.466102. The area was denoted as 'pillars A279 to A287' as per the 'draft' FTL map given by the North Tanks Division of the I&CAD, she said. She sought eviction of the encroachments. 





Survey predicts big win for TRS

Hyderabad: The Centre for Psephology Studies has predicted that the TRS will win nine of the 10 municipal corporations in the state and 104 to 109 municipalities of the 120 that went to the polls. Dr K Venugopal Rao, a noted psephologist, who conducted the survey in all the municipalities and corporations said the TRS will win 1,900 to 2,000 out of 2,727 wards in 120 municipalities The CPS said the contest was too close to predict in 6 to 12 per cent of the municipalities.
