HC grants conditional nod for NRC protests

Agitation kicks off today, Cops rapped for not allotting time

Terming as vague the orders issued by the police commissioner who permitted the January 25 meeting being organised by the United Muslims Action Committee and the MIM at Khilwat ground, Justice Tadakamalla Vinod Kumar of the Telangana High Court on Friday laid down a series of conditions.

Justice Vinod Kumar told the organisers not to hold bike rallies or hoist the National Flag. He said the volume of the loudspeakers should be in consonance with the Supreme Court guidelines (75 decibels during the day and 65 dB at night in residential areas). He capped the number of participants at 3,500 and directed that the event be held between 6 pm and 11 pm.

The court was adjudicating on a petition by one T. Uma Mahendra, who sought directions to the police not to grant permission to hold midnight demonstrations at Charminar as well as three Lunch Motion petitions filed on Friday by the Swami Vivekanandha Youth Welfare Association and two others opposing holding the meeting at Khilwat ground.

The court faulted the police commissioner for not mentioning number of speakers at the meeting and the time frame. Justice Vinod Kumar also inquired with the government counsel whether or not the state had received intelligence alerts from the Union home ministry on the CAA and NRC. He also referred to the recent communal riots at Bhainsa.

Government counsel Sharat said the state had received some alerts from the Centre and state officials had discussed the issue with the Union home ministry. Based on these, the organisers were told to change the venue to Khilwat grounds.

To this, Justice Vinod Kumar said, "Your contentions were the same when this court accorded permission for the rally and meeting on January 10, held by the same organisers, at Idgah Mir Alam. The police literally failed to control the mob

Cops break up anti-CAA protest at Moghalpura

The city police foiled an attempt by a group of women to stage a Shaheen Bagh-like protest against the CAA, NPR and NRC at Moghalpura early on Friday. Hundreds of youths gathered outside Hyder Bagh, the venue, to stand guard. They were briefly detained by the police.

Youths were providing a shield for women who were on an indefinite sit-in inside the Hyder Bagh, a private premises. The police had laid siege to the building and did not allow women, including Sheeba Saini, a key protester, to enter the building. Ms Saini argued against the restrictions and sat on the

road and started raising slogans against the police.

The youths who were standing guard also joined in. This incident was telecast live on Facebook. Within minutes, more than 500 youths gathered in Moghalpura and started raising slogans in different lanes. Many advocates reached the spot and argued with the police officials and said they should not intervene in events taking place at a private place unless there illegal activity.

Senior police officials led by in-charge deputy commissioner of police (South Zone) Avinash Mohanty reached the spot and asked the organisers to end the protest. They objected to the police intervention. He later directed the police to allow the women to enter the premises and the detained youths were released.

As soon as mediapersons left the spot, the police forced the women to leave the place. Before the action, the street lights were switched off. The protest continued till 4 am. The organisers alleged that the police brought pressure on the owner of the private premises to ask the protesters vacate the place.

and traffic went haywire, bringing the entire Old City to a grinding halt. Moreover, the number of participants quoted by you (government counsel) was 1,000 whereas the mob swelled to nearly a lakh. The writ petition is still pending before me and this court will take judicial note of all the blatant violations of orders."

Counsels for the petitioners opposed the permis-

sion accorded by the police commissioner to hold the meeting at Khilwat ground. They alleged that the police chief had been "very partisan" towards the organisers. They said the Khilwat ground is adjacent to the Charminar area, and holding a meeting there is equivalent to holding the meeting at Charminar. They insisted that

Justice Vinod Kumar direct the organisers to change the venue but the judge declined.

Counsels contended that the meeting may stretch into January 26, Republic Day, when the police will have to arrange foolproof security arrangements. If the police is made to work in such strenuous, arduous conditions, they will slip into frustration and it may affect their performance.

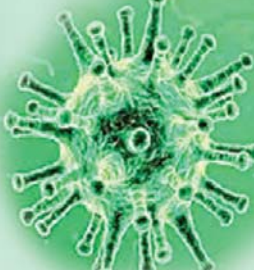

An environmentalist has alleged the encroachment of 10 acres of the full tank level (FTL) of Hussainsagar on the Necklace Road side, along the Kukatpally nala. The encroachers have laid roads and barricaded the area, which is invisible from the ground level but can be seen in satellite images.

Ms Lubna Sarwath, co-founder, Save Our Urban Lakes (SOUL), said she had conducted a field level survey on January 19 and found that the encroachment was within the FTL. She said that the encroachments were veri-

fied with documents from the Catchment Area Development (I&CAD) office at Secunderabad. "Plotting has been done, tar roads laid, barricades have been put up and construction is going on," Ms Sarwath said, providing the geographical locations of 17.437191, 78.466102. The area was denoted as 'pillars A279 to A287' as per the 'draft' FTL map given by the North Tanks Division of the I&CAD, she said. She sought eviction of the encroachments.

Neither the GHMC nor the HMDA were aware of the encroachment and constructions. When *Deccan Chronicle* alerted both the nodal agencies, they passed the buck to

each other. GHMC officials cited jurisdiction issues but agreed to check the construction on Saturday. A HMDA official claimed that the construction does not fall under the FTL level and the revenue department was responsible for the constructions.

There is a long background to the issue of land. A three-member committee led by late R. Rajamani and comprising R.C. Reddy and Sagar Dhara in 2005 in their report — the gold standard to measure encroachment around the Hussainsagar — had stat-

Hydroponic farming helps grow leafy vegetables easily

Hydroponic farming has made it much easier to farm greens like lettuce, spinach, Swiss chard, and kale, herbs like basil, parsley, oregano, cilantro, and tomatoes. These are organic and natural, don't need soil and grow fast. They are not prone to diseases much, are affordable and yield very well.

Growing hydroponic gardens has become a new trend in the past few months. Hydroponics, the practice of growing plants without the use of soil, uses specific water delivery processes to deliver nutrients directly to the roots.

Traditional agriculture farming uses around 80 per cent of surface and groundwater compared to hydroponics, which uses only 10 per cent of that under controlled conditions. Water keeps circulating within the system allowing plants to absorb the necessary water for active metabolism, while surplus water moves to the reservoir or storage tank to be cycled. There is no leaching, harmful runoff and there is little evaporation of water.

This type of system can

be installed at a place where the source water is not fit for growing agriculture crops or there is limited supply of water for general farming. An added benefit is the enhanced production capacity of the hydroponic indoor garden system with limited resources.

"For people who look for nontoxic, chemical free organic vegetables, greens and fruits, this one is the best ways of achieving a healthier lifestyle," says Mr Dinesh Madaram, a bonsai designer.

Reddanna, who has nearly 300 plants in his house at Masab Tank, told *Deccan Chronicle* that this sort of plantation ensures easy growing of vegetables, green leafy and other medical purposes plants. He also grows plants like insulin plant, which is regularly used to control diabetes, karpura tulsi and lemon grass, which keeps off mosquito.

Mr Paparao, another resident of Masab Tank, says the city lacks greenery and hydroponic farming process is needed for a healthier tomorrow.

E-TAILERS TOO CASH IN ON PATRIOTIC FERVOUR

Not just makers of the Indian flag, businesses are also cashing in on the NRC-CAA protests. Some sellers on e-commerce giant Amazon have listed two kinds of t-shirts, one supporting NRC-CAA, and other against.

As of January 24, there are at least two sellers trying to cash in on the protests. In an attempt to appeal to people on both sides of the argument, these sellers are offering two t-shirts, with the exact fonts and words — "CAA, NRC, NPR". One

t-shirt has these words crossed in red, while the other has a green tick mark.

Interestingly, one of the two sellers, Photo Basics, has chosen to list its shirts as "generic". Users wouldn't know Photo Basic's name unless they try to add a shirt to their cart.

The other seller, My Print Shop, has taken no such precautions.

Needless to say, the listings on the website haven't gone unnoticed. Multiple Twitter users have posted negative posts against the sellers, for their "ability to monetize everything".

Zubair added that most flags are cloth and not plastic, as was the case a few years ago. "The government has gotten strict about the usage of plastic," he said.

"Even customers want eco-friendly options. A vast majority in the market are cloth."

The protests have also resulted in a demand for the Tricolour from political parties.

A distributor from Abids said political parties have started placing orders for Indian flags along with party paraphernalia. This happened during the municipal polls' campaign.

"Earlier, before a rally or election campaign, political parties only used to place orders for party flags, stoles and so on," he said. "Now, they are adding flags to the order. The only time I saw this before was during the BJP's Gandhi Sankalp Yatra in October (to commemorate Gandhiji's birth anniversary)."

Over 10 acres in Hussainsagar FTL encroached: Activist

Neither the Urban Development Authority (Hyderabad) Rules notified on April 21, 1977, under the Act of 1975, or the Bhagyanagar (now known as Hyderabad) Urban Development Authority Zoning Regulations 1981 notified on September 3, 1981, mentions water bodies. In the latter, there are definitions for 'water course', 'minor water course' and 'major water course' and refer to storm water carrying channels. There is no further reference to them except that in the description of 'Recreational Use Zone' 'water fronts' are also mentioned.

In the HUDA map, notified in GO 381 of 23-6-1980,

the words 'water bodies' have been used, and the map shows 'Osmansagar' and 'Himayatsagar' as water bodies. In the MCH area 'Hussainsagar' has been shown.

In view of the revenue classification and the provisions of the Irrigation Act like the Telangana Irrigation Act, it appears the clear intention was to have a distinct classification of water bodies which would not be subject to the same rules and regulations as other land uses, sources said.

The issue of the notification by HUDA in May 2000 seems to be the result of subjecting lakes and water bodies to land use regulations.

KTR's Davos trip fetches ₹500 cr

Hyderabad: Industries minister K.T. Rama Rao's four-day trip to the World Economic Forum at Davos ended on Friday. A release from his office said the minister aimed to showcase Telangana state to multinational investors to draw more investment back home and create employment opportunities. Mr Rama Rao is said to have participated in 50 bilateral meetings with heads of global corporations. He met Google CEO Sundar Pichai, Coca Cola CEO James Quincey, Salesforce founder-chairman Marc Benioff and YouTube CEO Susan Wijckicki. The visit has reportedly fetched investment worth ₹500 crore from pharma major Piramal group. In another development, the government's T-Chits, a blockchain project by the IT department's emerging technologies wing, has won an award in the 23rd National Conference on e-governance. T-Chits captures transactions, verifies data, enables smart transactions and allows automated transactions between parties. It has been used by more than 10 lakh subscribers in the state.

Survey predicts big win for TRS

Hyderabad: The Centre for Psephology Studies has predicted that the TRS will win nine of the 10 municipal corporations in the state and 104 to 109 municipalities of the 120 that went to the polls. Dr K. Venugopal Rao, a noted psephologist, who conducted the survey in all the municipalities and corporations said the TRS will win 1,900 to 2,000 out of 2,727 wards in 120 municipalities. The CPS said the contest was too close to predict in 6 to 12 per cent of the municipalities. According to the CPS, the Congress will win in 320 to 340 wards, BJP 200 to 210, independents 90 to 100, MIM 50 to 55 and others in 40 to 50 wards. The BJP will likely to win one corporation. Out of the 385 divisions in corporations, the TRS is likely to get 224. The TRS vote share was predicted to be 58.1 per cent, the Congress 22.70, BJP 14.9 and MIM 1.70 per cent in the corporations. In the municipalities the TRS voteshare will 52.3 per cent, Congress 23.3 per cent, BJP 14.1 and MIM 1.6 per cent. The Congress may win two municipalities and the MIM one, the CPS survey predicted.

BJP OBJECTS TO OWAISI'S ADVICE AGAINST GOVT

BJP Greater Hyderabad unit president N. Ramchander Rao, MLC, has condemned the appeal of MIM MP Asaduddin Owaisi, asking people not to cooperate with government officials who visit their houses to collect data under the provisions of the Citizenship Amendment Act. Speaking to the media on Friday, he alleged that the MIM president is provoking and instigating people against government officials, which is nothing but a move to radicalise people. The BJP leader asked Mr Owaisi to stop instigating people in the name of CAA, NCR and NPR. "The appeal exposes the 'dangerous attitude' of the Hyderabad MP," the BJP MLC remarked. He condemned the attack on state BJP office on Thursday and demanded that the state government order an inquiry into the incident. He recounted that a group of unidentified persons, suspected to be MIM members, came to state BJP office, tried to gatecrash and attack the people inside. Camp politics starts in TS

TRS, Congress maintain tight security to keep flock together

With counting of votes polled in municipal elections slated to commence on Saturday, "camp politics" have commenced in both the ruling TRS and the Opposition Congress. All their candidates, who contested from various wards of municipalities, have been shifted to camps at the headquarters of the municipal councils and corporations.

The TRS leadership has directed in-charges of municipalities, including ministers and MLAs, to keep their candidates safe from "poaching" until elections of municipal chairpersons and mayors of municipal corporations are not completed. The candidates are being provided the best of facilities to prevent "horse trading", whether in big hotels or farmhouses. Some have been shifted to neighbouring states. Tight security is being

maintained by parties at these camps, particular in those municipalities and corporations, where there is a close fight. Each councillor is expected to play a key role. The aspiring candidates for chairpersons and mayors are having to bear the expenditure incurred on these camps.

Meanwhile, the TRS leadership has given powers to its MLAs to issue whips for electing the official nominees as municipal chairpersons and corporation mayors. Before issuing B forms, both TRS and Congress had administered oath to candidates that they would abide by party's decision on the choice of chairpersons and mayors. Congress has taken a pledge even in writing that they will not change their party after winning.

Several TRS rebels have contested as candidates of the Forward Bloc Party. TRS leadership is hoping that the rebels will support its official nominees as mayors and chairpersons. Fears of defections are more in the Congress than the TRS, with the former experiencing a bitter lesson in the last assembly elections. While TRS is expecting to sweep the elections, Congress is hoping to win a good number of seats.

KCR confident of TRS setting victory record

The TRS, which had registered impressive victories in the Assembly, Parliament, and zilla and mandal parishad elections is hopeful of continuing the trend in the January municipal elections when the results are declared on Saturday. TRS cadres are curious over the outcome in view of the claims of the Congress and BJP that there are keen contests at several places. The State Election Commission had conducted elections to 2,727 wards in 120 municipalities. In another 80 wards, the election was unopposed. In nine

municipal corporations, the SEC conducted polling for 324 divisions, and another division chose its candidate unopposed. Sources close to Chief Minister K. Chandrababurao said he was confident of a landslide. He feels the TRS will create history by winning more than 100 municipalities and nine corporations. Sources said the TRS won all the zilla parishads, an unprecedented feat. During the district elections, out of 537 Zilla Parishad Territorial Constituency (ZPTC) seats the TRS won 448 (83.42 per cent). Congress 75 (13.9 per cent) and the BJP eight (0.14 per cent). Out of

5,817 Mandal Parishad Territorial Constituencies, the TRS won 3,556 (61.13 per cent), Congress 1,377 (23.67 per cent), BJP 211 (3.62 per cent). In the 2016 Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation elections, the TRS registered a huge victory by winning 99 wards out of 150 wards. A TRS leader said the country had witnessed performance of the TRS after it returned to power in the December 2018 Assembly elections. He said the people would never disappoint the TRS and Mr Rao. The results of the civic polls will further boost the TRS and Opposition parties will be disappointed.

ACB court wants data on stays Naidu secured

CBI dismisses Jagan's petition

The CBI special court here on Friday dismissed a petition filed by YSRC president and AP Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy seeking personal exemption from the hearing of the Enforcement Directorate case filed against him. The court made it clear that Mr Reddy has to appear on trial day and adjourned the hearing to January 31. The court expressed dissatisfaction that Mr Reddy was filing exemption petitions on every trial day. On Friday, Mr Reddy had filed a memo through his advocate seeking exemption from personal appearance. Allowing the plea, the court said that it would not allow such petitions every week. After he took oath as Chief Minister last year, Mr



Reddy has appeared once before the CBI court. The court also heard the contentions of Mr Reddy in the discharge petitions filed by him in relation to the cases filed by the CBI. Mr Niranjan Reddy, counsel, submitted that Mr Reddy should be discharged. The CBI court also agreed to frame charges against senior IAS officer Manmohan Singh under the Prevention of Corruption Act, in relation to investments by Vampic (Vadarevu and Nizampatnam Industrial Corridor) in companies owned by Mr Reddy.

SEC gears up for counting of votes

The State Election Commission (SEC) has made all arrangements for counting of votes for the 120 municipalities and nine municipal corporation elections on Saturday. Counting for the Karimnagar Municipal Corporation, where elections were held on Friday, will be taken up on January 27. Briefing the media, SEC Commissioner V. Nagireddy, along with Municipal Administration Director Dr T.K. Sridevi, said that the results will be out by Saturday evening. Elections for the posts of chairpersons, vice-chairpersons, mayor and deputy mayor will be held on January 27. If the votes were equal in the indirect election, the winner would be selected by lottery. He said that political parties should give the names of the mayor and chairperson by A and B forms. He said that the A-Form submission is by 11 am on January 26 and B-Form submission by 10 am the next day. Political parties may issue whip as per the

annexure forms that are issued by the SEC. Mr Reddy said that the model code of conduct will be in force till Saturday evening. He said the polling percentage for 120 municipalities was 74.40 and 58.83 per cent for the nine corporations. Dr Sridevi said that ex-officio members also have the right to vote in the election of mayors and municipal chairpersons. She explained that if there are more municipalities or corporations within the constituency of the MLA concerned or the MP, they should give the option to municipal commissioners before the conclusion of counting. Responding to Minister G. Kamlakar's comments after casting his vote in Karimnagar on Friday, he said that the SEC will examine it. If they found it to be in violation of election rules, the SEC will take appropriate action, including invoking criminal proceedings. The Minister had disclosed that he had voted for the TRS and claimed that 70 per cent of voters had cast in favour of the ruling party.

INDEPENDENTS MAY HOLD KEY FOR TOP POSTS

Independents and candidates of small parties are likely to swing the fortunes of major political parties, as they might hold the key to power in case these parties do not get a majority in the wards of municipalities and corporations.

Even before counting of votes polled in 120 municipalities and nine municipal corporations commences, major political parties have started focusing on independents whose chances of winning are high. The parties are trying to make deals with them for supporting their party candidates in the indirect elections to the posts of chairpersons and mayors. Candidates numbering 12,898 contested from different wards of the municipalities and corporations, with as many as 3,749 of them being independents. Those aspiring for tickets of the ruling TRS contested as independents when they failed in getting the official nomination. In Ramagundam Municipal Corporation alone, 54 independents, including rebel candidates, contested; their number in Jangaon municipality being 44. Sources in TRS disclosed that the party has promised some independents even posts of vice chairperson or deputy mayor in lieu of their support when corporation mayors and municipal chairpersons are to be elected on January 27.
