Chinese Premier Li Keqiang visits virus-hit Wuhan as toll rises to 81

Prime Minister promises medical reinforcements and adequate market supply

Chinese Premier Li Keqiang will "inspect and direct" efforts to control a virus outbreak in the central city of Wuhan and promised reinforcements, as provincial authorities faced accusations from the public of a failure to respond in time.

Mr. Li, clad in a blue protective suit and mask, thanked medical workers in Wuhan, the capital of Hubei province and the epicentre of the outbreak, as the death toll rose on Monday to 81.

"Li ... thanked frontline medical workers for their allout efforts in treating patients and urged them to pay attention to their own protection," Xinhua news agency said. "He required efforts to guarantee medical resources supply, race against time to treat patients and ensure adequate market supply and stable prices."

He said 2,500 more medical workers would arrive in the next two days. Mr. Li is the most senior leader to visit Wuhan since the outbreak began. He inspected efforts to contain the epidemic and was shown on state television leading medical workers in chants of "Wuhan jiayou!" – an exhortation to keep their strength up.

He also visited the construction site of a new hospital due to be built in days.

On China's heavily censored social media, where dissent is typically suppressed, local officials have borne the brunt of mounting public anger about the handling of the virus.

Some lashed out at the Hubei Governor, who had to correct himself twice during a news conference over the

Trump denies telling Bolton Ukraine aid was tied to probe

Democrats want the ex-NSA, other officials to testify in trial

President Donald Trump on Monday denied that he told his former National Security Advisor John Bolton that military aid to Ukraine was tied to Kiev investigating his political rivals.

Mr. Trump's tweets came after The New York Times reported on Sunday that Mr. Bolton alleges as much in a draft of his upcoming book.

"I NEVER told John Bolton that the aid to Ukraine was tied to investigations into Democrats, including the Bidens. In fact, he never complained about this at the time of his very public termination," Mr. Trump tweeted on Monday. "If John Bolton said this, it was only to sell a

Citing Mr. Bolton's unpublished manuscript, NYT wrote that Mr. Trump told

Chinese tourist in Sri Lanka tests positive for Coronavirus

Sri Lanka on Monday reported the first case of Coronavirus, after a Chinese tourist tested positive, health authorities said

"The Chinese woman is from Hubei Province and in her early 40s. She tested positive today and we have started treatment," said Dr. Sudath Samaraweera, a spokesman of the Ministry of Health.

The tourist arrived in Sri Lanka on January 19 and reported fever on January 25, after which she was admitted to the Infectious Diseas-

es Hospital near Colombo. "We have also sent her test samples abroad for another confirmation of the results, Dr. Samaraweera told The Hindu. "Our doctors are very experienced and well equipped to handle the cases," Dr. Samaraweera added.

Over the last week, Sri Lanka's health authorities reported five cases of suspected Coronavirus. Of them, two patients tested negative and the results of other patients' are awaited.

China was the third largest source of tourists to Sri Lanka in 2019, according to the Sri Lanka Tourism Development Authority (SLTDA) contributing 9% of the total arrivals of nearly 20 lakh. India is the largest, with 19% of the tourists originating from there. SLTDA records show that over 16,000 Chinese tourists arrived in Sri Lanka in December 2019.

Meanwhile, as many as 21 Sri Lankan students were returning from China following the outbreak, the President's office said. Further, the Civil Aviation Authority has set up a separate arrival terminal, with necessary screening mechanisms, at the Bandaranaike International Airport, officials said.

+ 'Prince Andrew provided zero cooperation on Epstein probe'

Britain's Prince Andrew has provided "zero cooperation" to the American investigators who want to interview him about his dealings with the late millionaire sex offender Jeffrey Epstein, a U.S. prosecutor said Monday.

U.S. Attorney Geoffrey Berman said prosecutors and the FBI had contacted Prince Andrew's lawyers and asked to interview him. "To date, Prince Andrew has provided zero cooperation," said Mr. Berman.

Prince Andrew announced last year that he

was withdrawing from his royal duties amid renewed public attention to a woman's claim that she had several sexual encounters with the Prince at Epstein's behest, starting at the age of 17.

The woman said that after meeting Epstein in Florida

in 2000, the millionaire flew her around the world and pressured her into having sex with numerous older men, including Prince Andrew, two senior U.S. politicians, a noted academic, wealthy financiers and the attorney Alan Dershowitz, who is now part of President Donald Trump's impeachment defence team. All of those men have denied the allegations.

Ms. Giuffre has said she had sex with Andrew three times at Epstein's request, including once in London in 2001 at the home of Epstein's girlfriend, Ghislaine

A prominent Pakistani Pashtun minority leader, known for criticising the country's powerful military, was arrested on Monday on alleged sedition charges, leading to calls for his immediate and unconditional release.

Manzoor Pashteen, 27, chief of the rights-based alliance Pashtun Tahaffuz Movement (PTM), attended a gathering on January 18 in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Dera Ismail Khan city, where he had allegedly said that the 1973 Constitution violated basic human rights, Dawn newspaper reported. He was arrested along with nine others.

The 62nd annual Grammy Awards anointed a new star in Billie Eilish, even as the mood on Sunday night was darkened by the death earlier that day of basketball great Kobe Bryant, who spent much of his NBA career playing at the Staples Centre, the arena where the

show was held. Ms. Eilish, an 18-year-old auteur with a moody and idiosyncratic aesthetic, won five awards, including the four most prestigious and competitive prizes – album, record and song of the year, and best new artist. She was the first artist to sweep the top awards since Christopher Cross in 1981, besting competition from Lizzo, Lil Nas

Mr. Finneas, as he is known, also won producer of the year and an engineering award.


Lil Nas X, a gleeful master of internet memes, won two for his "country-trap" hybrid Old Town Road: best pop duo/group performance and best music video.

Sacred Thirumurugattrupadai

Thirumurugattrupadai is one of the works in the Sangam era anthology titled Pathupaattu. It is a devotional poem, where all six divine abodes of Lord Muruga find place. It has a further distinction. It is included in the Tamil Saivite canonical texts known as Thirumurais. It is, in fact, the eleventh Thirumurai in this collection. While the six abodes of Lord Muruga have been in continuous worship till date, the names by which we refer to some of these places are different from the names which Nakkeerar uses for them in his verses. So, it is clear that they were known by those names in the past. Tiruchendur, for example, is referred to as Thirucheeralaiavai in Thirumurugattrupadai. Palani is referred to as Thiru Avinankudi. Every letter in Thirumurugattrupadai has the power of a mantra, which explains its popularity, elaborated S. Gangadharan, in a discourse. Even those not familiar with the other Sangam works, learn to recite this hymn in praise of Lord Muruga.

The lines in praise of the deity of Palani begin with a description of the people who go to meet Lord Muruga, to pay obeisance to Him. Leading the procession are sages. The appearance of these sages is described vividly by the poet. Their garments are fashioned out of the bark of trees. Their hair is as white as a conch. A deer skin is draped across their chests. Their appearance is skeletal, with their rib cage protruding. The next line gives us an idea as to why they look so thin. They eat very little, foregoing food for several days, says the poet. There is no malice in them, and they do not wish anyone ill. Their minds are free of anger. Because of their jnana, they are natural leaders. They are not prey to temptations of the flesh, and therefore, they are free from suffering.
