### Draft Bill proposes raising abortion upper limit to 24 weeks

Contraceptive-failure provision to end pregnancy to cover unmarried women

MOVING TO ease abortion laws in the country, the Union Cabinet is set to consider a host of changes to the Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) Act, 1971 to increase the upper limit for termination of a pregnancy from 20 weeks to 24 weeks, and extending the contraceptive-failure clause for termination to include "any woman or her partner" from the present provision for "only married woman or her husband".

Sources said the draft MTP Bill has been circulated by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and the Cabinet has to take a decision on its approval.

The present abortion law, which is about five decades old, permits abortion up to a maximum foetal gestation period of 20 weeks. Section 3 (2) of the MTP Act, 1971 states "a pregnancy may be terminated by a registered medical practitioner, (a) where the length of the pregnancy does not exceed twelve weeks, if such medical practitioner is, or (b) where the length CONTINUED ON PAGE 2

# Plan to cut Army from internal security duties in N-E: Chief

THE ARMY plans to draw down all its regular forces deployed in counter-insurgency, counter-terrorism and internal security duties from the North-East in the next 18-24 months, to focus on conventional warfare, said Army Chief General M M Naravane.

He said that two battalions have already been taken off from such duties and the next draw-

down will happen after the Bodoland elections in Assam are completed in June-July this year. "The North-East is going

through a very transitional phase, for the good. The security situation is improving as shown by the

recent surrender of 600 members of National Democratic Front of Bodoland (NDFB) and other groups. We are working on a plan for the next 18-24 months on how to draw down regular forces from CI/CT/ internal security duties there," General Naravane told The Indian Express.

The observations made in the bail order are significant. Bijnor police arrested over 100 people and lodged multiple FIRs, claiming they indulged in violence at Nahtaur, Najibabad

## Govt ringfences 'prudent commercial decisions' of top public sector bankers

CITING THE need to protect prudent commercial decisions of bankers, the Finance Ministry said Tuesday it has "done away with" holding MDs and CEOs of public sector banks personally responsible for compliance in dealing with large-value frauds committed by bank officials.

In a statement, the Ministry said that it has delegated powers to the boards of state-owned lenders to put in place a "suitable mechanism" for ensuring "compliance with the various timelines laid down in RBI (Reserve Bank of India) and CVC (Central Vigilance Commission) CONTINUED ON PAGE 2


