Former India captain Bishan Singh Bedi remarked on twitter, "This kind of rowdy behaviour by anyone is unpardonable - least of all by proposed captain of India-A - no matter how talented, no player was ever bigger than the game - example needs setting - let a more balanced person lead India-A before the referee's intimidated too!".

Bedi recalled how once Bapu Nadkarni stood his ground after being given out. "Bapu got into an argument with the bowler and not the umpire. Our captain (Tiger Pataudi) would have none of it and told Bapu to immediately return to the
