Have not resigned, not unhappy: Sena's Sattar

A DAY after he threatened to resign, Shiv Sena MLA and Minister of State Abdul Sattar met Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray on Sunday and said he is satisfied and that there is no question of him being unhappy.

Sattar told mediapersons that he had not resigned. "I have given (the CM) information about those who created rumours about me being unhappy. After meeting Uddhav ji, I am now satisfied and there is no question of unhappiness," he said when asked whether he was unhappy at not being made a Cabinet minister. In the portfolios allotted on Sunday, Sattar was chosen as MoS for Revenue and Rural Development.

Reports that Sattar was disgruntled over being allocated a MoS berth emerged after his supporters — six zilla parishad members — extended support to Sena rebel and BJP-backed Devyani Dongaokar for the president's post and BJP's L G Gaikwad for the deputy president's post in the Aurangabad Zilla Parishad, elections to which were held on Saturday. The Sena was contesting the elections under the banner of Maha Vikas Aghadi, the ruling alliance which includes the Congress and the NCP.

NCP BAGS IMPORTANT PORTFOLIOS

Ajit Pawar gets finance, Anil Deshmukh home

SIX DAYS after Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray expanded his Cabinet, portfolios were allocated to the 36 newly-inducted ministers from Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress on Sunday. While Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar bagged the finance and planning portfolio, his colleague in the NCP, Anil Deshmukh, is the new home minister. First-time MLA and Cabinet minister Aaditya Thackeray has been allocated environment, tourism and protocol.

The NCP bagged important portfolios such as home, finance, excise and cooperation and rural development, among others. While Sena retained the agriculture portfolio, Congress, which was seeking an additional key portfolio in rural sector — either agriculture, cooperation or rural development — settled for other departments such as ports, cultural affairs and sports and youth welfare offered by the Sena. The Congress bagged revenue, energy and public works departments.

The announcement was made after Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyani approved the allocation of portfolios as proposed by Uddhav on Sunday morning. The list was sent to the Governor for approval on

Why portfolio allocation was delayed

WHILE THE allocation of portfolios was delayed due to an apparent disagreement among Sena, NCP and Congress, NCP and Sena had blamed the Governor for not approving the list on Saturday itself and further delaying the process by one more day.

Saturday evening.

Senior Sena leaders Subhash Desai, Eknath Shinde, Uday Samant, Dada Bhuse, Sanjay Rathod, Gulabrao Patil and Anil Parab have been allocated industries, urban development, higher and technical education, agriculture, forest and relief and rehabilitation, water supply and

transport portfolios, respectively.

On the other hand, senior NCP leaders Jayant Patil, Chhagan Bhujbal, Nawab Malik and Jitendra Awhad have been allocated water resources, food and civil supplies, minority development and housing departments, respectively. NCP's Hasan Mushrif will handle the rural development portfolio.

While former CM and senior Congress leader Ashok Chavan has been given the public works Department, state party chief Balasaheb Thorat will hold the revenue portfolio. Congress's Nitin Raut, Vijay Wadettiwar and Amit Deshmukh have got energy, other backward classes and medical education portfolios, respectively.

Amid reports of him threatening to resign, Sena legislator and Minister of State (MoS) Abdul Sattar was allocated the revenue and rural development portfolios. The other MoS portfolios were allocated to Congress' Satej Patil (home urban), Sena's Shambhuraj Desai (home rural), NCP's Prajakt Tanpure (urban development) and Aditi Tatkare (industries) as well as Congress's Vishwajit Kadam (cooperation).

On Monday, Uddhav had expanded the Cabinet by inducting 36 ministers. With 56 MLAs, Sena got 15 berths and NCP, with 54 MLAs, got 16. The Congress, with 44 MLAs, has 12 ministerial berths.

After report on baby deaths in Gujarat, Dy CM points to 'cyclical phenomenon'

Rajkot: As many as 111 infants died at Rajkot civil hospital and 88 in Ahmedabad in December 2019, Deputy Chief Minister Nitin Patel said on Sunday, adding that the deaths, on the higher side, was a "cyclical phenomenon". He claimed that the state government managed to reduce infant mortality rate (IMR) to below 25 from 30 three years ago.

Following a report published by a vernacular daily on Sunday claiming that 134 infants died in Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Hospital in Rajkot and 85 in Ahmedabad civil hospital, Patel cited official records and said that 111 infants died in Rajkot and 88 in Ahmedabad in December. He further said that 87 infants died in the Rajkot hospital in October and 71 in November. The same figures for Ahmedabad hospital were 91 and 74.

Addressing a press conference in Ahmedabad, Patel said that IMR was a sensitive issue but suggested it was a cyclical phenomenon. "The records suggest that as compared to October and November, deaths were more in December in both Rajkot and Ahmedabad. When I asked doctors and experts for reasons, they said birth rate goes up in winter. They said that natural causes of infant deaths also increase in winter, consequently IMR also goes up," Patel said.

KOTA INFANT DEATHS

Rajasthan health minister takes veiled jibe at Pilot

RAJASTHAN HEALTH minister Raghu Sharma on Friday took a veiled jibe at Deputy Chief Minister Sachin Pilot, saying that the administrative officers of Kota's JK Lon hospital had written to the Public Works Department numerous times for repair work and it was their responsibility to get the work done.

Incidentally, Pilot holds the portfolio of Public Works Department in the state and is the PWD minister.

"If there is my mistake there should be my accountability too. Today, maintenance work is also done in hospitals. This question was also raised that doors and windows are broken, sewage water enters, water dripping from the roof. When numerous times the administrative officers of the hospital write to the PWD,

then the responsibility is theirs to ensure that timely repair is done," Sharma told reporters on Sunday.

A day before, Pilot had said that instead of pointing out the "misdeeds" of the previous government, the emphasis should be on "fixing accountability."

"RMRS meetings happen regularly. These public representatives who raise questions, do they go to these meetings? If they go in these meetings, they will come to know at that time which equipment in this hospital is non functional, what is to be purchased. Rs. 6 crore is available. Had the public representatives there went to the meetings regularly, or had sent their representatives, then they themselves would have known that the hospital had certain shortcomings. It is the responsibility of every person, and this is such a topic that no person can shirk from his responsibility," Sharma added.

Nirmala to Gehlot: Listen to deputy

UNION FINANCE Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Sunday hit out at the Ashok Gehlot-led Congress government in Rajasthan over the death of over a 100 children at the JK Lon hospital in Kota since December 1.

"I come to Rajasthan every time with great joy because of the hospitality of people and their warmth...It's a very colourful state. Where in such a state, bad news is coming everyday about innocent children. The chief minister is not paying attention. He is talking against the entire country. It shows where his interest lies. He is concentrating on CAA so that he doesn't

lose the minority vote. It would be better if he focuses on the kids in the hospital, and the little children of Rajasthan," Sitharaman told reporters in Jaipur on Sunday.

Reacting to Gehlot's opposition against CAA and the allegations that the BJP doesn't talk about the economy, Sitharaman said the Congress leader should listen to Deputy Chief Minister Sachin Pilot on the issue of deaths of infants.

"Let him please listen to his own deputy chief minister who has come out very clearly," she said.

Pilot had criticised his own government on Saturday and said that the state government's response could have been "more sensitive and compassionate".

Terror alert along border with Nepal

TWO SUSPECTED ISIS terrorists have entered Uttar Pradesh, following which a high alert has been sounded along the India-Nepal border in Maharajganj, Kushinagar and Siddharth Nagar districts, a top police official said on Sunday.

"It has come to the fore that two wanted terrorists — Abdul Samad and Iliyas — can escape to Nepal from UP," IG (Basti Range) Ashutosh Kumar said. The alert was sounded after the intelligence input was received, he said.

The IG said photographs of the two have been widely circulated so that they could be identified. The officer said he was not aware which outfit they were affiliated to.

Previously, they were spotted in West Bengal's Siliguri and are suspected to be associated with the ISIS.

Member of first Lok Sabha Kamal Singh dies

Patna: Kamal Bahadur Singh, a member of the first Lok Sabha and the last maharaja of the erstwhile Dumraon Raj, died at 93 early on Sunday morning. Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar called Singh's death the "end of a golden and glorious era" and recalled his immense contribution in the health and education sectors, particularly in Buxar.

Singh is survived by his sons Chandravijay Singh and Manvijay Singh. "Kamal Bahadur Singh had been unwell for the past six years. He breathed his last in Bhojpur Kothi at 5.10 am," Chandravijay Singh said.

In his condolence message, the Bihar CM said, "Kamal Bahadur Singh's contribution in field of education and social development has been remarkable. His demise marks end of a golden and glorious era. He had made huge donations for the cause of health and education".

IPS officer booked for 'molesting' teenager

A SUPERINTENDENT of Police in Assam district has been booked under Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act for allegedly sexually harassing a 13-year-old daughter of a fellow police officer during a party on December 31, top officials said.

A senior police officer said that a case was registered against the IPS officer in Guwahati on January 3 based on a complaint by the mother of the victim. "Yes, there is a case against him. There is the law and everything will proceed as per the law," Assam DGP BJ Mahanta told *The Indian Express*.

The accused IPS officer did not respond to multiple attempts by *The Indian Express* for comment.

Missing Dalit woman found hanging from tree

THE BODY of a 20-year-old Dalit woman, who reportedly went missing on January 1, was found hanging from a tree in a village of Modasa taluka in Aravalli district on Sunday.

Modasa Rural police have filed a case of accidental death and probe is underway.

A family member of the deceased said that the girl, a graduate, operated a beauty parlour. "She left home on January 1. After she didn't return home the next day, her father had given a complaint to Modasa Town police and had named a suspect for the mysterious disappearance of his daughter. However, (Modasa Town) the police did not register an offence and told the father that the case falls under the jurisdiction of Modasa Rural police. On Sunday morning, the woman's body was found hanging from a tree in the neighbouring village," said the family member.

The person also alleged that the Modasa Town police did not register the case as the suspect and the police inspector are from the same community.

Aravalli SP Mayur Patil said that police did not take any coercive action against the person named as suspect by the woman's father because there was not enough evidence to do so.
