

### Govt to take 15 foreign envoys minus EU on two-day visit to J&K today

NEW DELHI, JANUARY 8

FIVE MONTHS after revoking Jammu and Kashmir's special status and bifurcating the state into two Union territories, the government will take a group of 15 foreign envoys to Srinagar on

Thursday, for a two-day visit to review the ground situation. However, the delegation will not comprise European Union envoys, who will be taken later, said sources.

According to government sources, EU envoys wanted to visit I&K as a group. It was not possible to accommodate all of

them due to restrictions on numbers, and the plan to keep the group broad-based.

"We wanted to take a global group of envoys to J&K with only some EU ambassadors; not all EU envoys were asked to join," said a government source.

#### Muzaffarpur shelter home: No inmate was killed, all traced, CBI tells SC

IN A twist to the Muzaffarpur shelter home abuse case, the CBI told the Supreme Court Wednesday there was no evidence that any inmate had been murdered, as was alleged earlier.

Appearing for the CBI, Attorney General K K Venugopal told a bench of Chief Justice of India S A Bobde and Justices B R Gavai and Surya Kant that there were 35 girls at the shelter home. The agency said all the 35 girls had been traced, and found to be alive.

Venugopal said some of the inmates had earlier alleged that minors had been murdered, and their bodies buried. "When the probe agency went to the spot where the alleged bodies were buried, two skeleton parts were

UNDER PRESSURE from protesting students and teachers to quit, JNU V-C M Jagadesh Kumar may well dig his heels in. For, barely a month ago, he had his way.

The Indian Express has reliably learned that Kumar was given an ultimatum on December 11 to either accept a compromise formula to end the standoff with agitating students or resign. In less than 48 hours, the then Higher Education

Secretary R Subrahmanyam was himself shunted out.

According to the formula proposed by the Ministry, the INU administration would charge

only the increased room rent and the service and utility charges were to be borne by the University Grants Commission. In exchange, the students would call off their agitation and engage in dialogue with the university administration. To compensate for the lost academic period, JNU was asked to extend the semester by two weeks. The university was also advised to notify the students' union and withdraw po-

# New Parliament not break from past, rather working with it, says man behind redesign

WITH A capacity to accommodate 800-1,200 people, the Lok Sabha hall inside the new Parliament

building will accommodate both

Houses twice a year for the joint parliamentary session — unlike the current Parliament where the sessions take place inside the Central Hall. "This was a suggestion by Prime Minister Narendra Modi," said Dr Bimal Patel, architect and urban planner, whose Gujarat-based firm won the consultancy bid for the coveted redevelopment project of the Central Vista in New Delhi.

On Wednesday, Patel, speaking at The Indian Express Idea Exchange, said the Central Vista

redevelopment project is expected to be finished by 2024, which is the deadline set for his firm. Patel said the PM wanted to ensure the project is "not stuck endlessly". "I've worked with him in the past, so I'm not surprised," he said.

Patel said the facade of the new Parliament will be made of Agra red sandstone, like the rest of the structures. "This is not a break from the past; this is in fact taking the past and working
