US, Taliban ink peace deal Uneasy calm as bodies

14-month timeframe to withdraw troops from Afghanistan

Doha. Feb. 29: The United States signed a landmark deal with the Taliban on Saturday, laying out a timetable for a full troop withdrawal from Afghanistan within 14 months as it seeks an exit from its longest-ever war. The agreement is expected to lead to a dialogue between the Taliban and

the Kabul government that, if successful, could ultimately see an end to the grinding 18-year con-

flict Taliban fighter-turned-dealmaker Mullah Bara-dar signed the accord alongside Washington's chief negotiator Zalmay Khalilzad, at a gilded desk in a conference room in a luxury Doha hotel.

The pair then shook hands, as people in the room shouted *Allahu* Akbar (God is greatest).

US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo looked on as the two inked the deal, after urging the insur-gents to "keep your promises to ut tise with promises to cut fies with Al-Qaeda" On the eve of the signing, US President Donald

Trump urged the Afghan people to embrace the chance for a new future. "If the Taliban and the government of Afgha-nistan live up to these

The eerie silence in vio-lence-hit Old Mustafabad was shattered by wails, as the bodies of riot victims, released by the authorities, began arriving Saturday morning. Fear still stalks nearby Shiv Vihar, now destroyed, whose mostly Muslim residents have taken refuge in nearby Chaman Park, fearing another attack. As a brittle peace settles in northeast Delhi, officials have started assessing the damage for compensation. The bodies of brothers Aamir (27) and Hashim (17) were fished out of the nearby "nala" where other bodies were found. Some with bullet marks, some with severed limbs, and some torn in two. Death did not come easy; it was brutal


questions on the safety of women is the existence of SOS booths on


An SOS booth at Shamshabad that is supposed to let a woman in danger talk directly to the Police Control Room, is not functioning. – DEEPAK DESHPANDE



Peace committees active once again

Be it a "good time" of festivals or "'bad time" during riots, peace committees comprising members both Hindu and slim communities of both Muslim have always been around in the twin cities to ensure peace.

In the past, whenever there were communal clashes, especially in Old City, peace committee members could be seen pleading with stone-pelters and angry protesters to calm down and return home. For police, these committee members were 'eyes and ears".

With deadly riots in northeast Delhi, which have left over 40 dead and more than 300 injured, role of peace committees is back in focus.

With temperatures high across the country, including in Hyderabad in terms of pro and anti-Citizenship (Amen-dment) Act (CAA) and National Register of Citizens (NRC) protests, police are relying heavily police are relying heavily on peace committees in the city to continue maintaining peace.

'Every Sunday, all peace committee members hold meeting and discuss various issues pertaining to different communities in our area. We have succeeded in doing our bit in ensuring peace during the anti-CAA protests. We have been emphasising on agitators the need for non-violent protests", says Hyderabad peace committee general secretary Ghulam Sadiquddin. Confirming this is joint commissioner of police holding charge of east zone, DCP M. Ramesh.

He said, "The peace committees are very active. Their members are from all walks of life and highly disciplined. They always come forward offering support to the police.'

The concept of peace committees started way back in 1980s. But their role was officially recognised only in early 2000s when the then Hyderabad police commissioner M. V. Krishna Rao officially appreciated their efforts. Since then, peace committees have been working shoulder to shoulder with police officials.

However, as the city has largely remained peaceful since the last couple of committees has been limited to taking people into confidence during festivals of both communities. Sadiquddin explains that their members have the ability to sort out any issue between the two communities through

erapad: Central Railway (SCR) has introduced QR (quick response) code ticketing at its railway stations for the unreserved passengers. Travellers can scan the code at stations and within onekilometre vicinity through the Railways' UTS application. Gajanan Mallya, general manager, SCR said passengers could use the new system to avoid queues at stations and save time. Meanwhile, SCR has also made possible buying unreserved and platform tickets through automatic ticket vending machines (ATVM). These machines have been enabled with fast-booking features.

Private Universities Act opposed

Hyderabad: Students of Osmania University have 'rejected' the Private Universities Act passed by the state government in the first-ever student parliament held at the university. The student parliament discussed bills on reintroduction of student union elections, women's reservation in Parliament, and Representation of the People's Act, apart from the one allowing private universities in the state. About 70 students from the 24 depart-ments of the Arts College took part in the event. The private universities Act was rejected on the grounds that privatisation of education would burden the economically backward students, and education would eventually become unaffordable for the weaker sections of society. They said education was a basic right and the government should not do anything to deny them this right. Students backed the 'One nation One election' proposal, saying it would cut down on expenses and avoid the delays caused by the repeated imposition of the model code of conduct. The idea of conducting the student parliament was a student initiative.




Kejri reviews relief operations

New Delhi: Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal held a review meeting with sub-divisional magistrates on Saturday to take stock of relief operations in riot-affected areas of northeast Delhi. Flanked by his deputy Manish Sisodia, Kejriwal told reporters that the Delhi government wants to ensure that normalcy returns in people's lives, for which several steps are being taken by the authorities. The meeting was attended by around 18 subdivisional magistrates who have been deployed in violence-affected areas. Social Welfare Minister Rajendra Pal Gautam was also present at the meeting. The chief minister said the government has so far received 67 compensation forms from people, adding the SDMs have launched an exercise to access the damage caused.

Cong hits out at **Delhi Police**

New Delhi: The Congress on Saturday accused the police of carrying out a "onesided" investigation into the violence in Delhi and urged the Supreme Court to appoint an amicus curiae to scrutinise all such cases in which protesters and activists were being slapped


