# EU seeks to tackle virus as infections spread

Italian PM asks for easing borrowing limits to contain the outbreak; six inmates die in a prison riot over new restrictions

EU leaders will seek a coordinated response to the coronavirus after Italy sealed off much of its industrial north, where six prisoners were killed in a riot over curbs on

EU leaders will hold a teleconference to discuss their next moves, European Council President Charles Michel said, with one official saying the call was likely to take place on Tuesday. "We need to cooperate in order to protect the health of our citizens," Mr. Michel, who chairs EU summits, tweeted.

In little more than two weeks, the number of people infected in Italy rose to 9,172 an increase of 1,797 on Sunday's figures. Italy's civil protection agency reported 97 new deaths, bringing the country's toll to 463, the second-highest death toll after China's, putting its health

system under huge strain. More than 1,10,000 peo-

ple have been infected in 105 countries and territories, and 3.800 have died, the vast majority in mainland China, according to a Reuters tally.

Italian Prime Minister Giuseppe Conte said strict European Union borrowing limits should be loosened and the flexibility envisaged by EU budget rules should be used

"Europe cannot think of

confronting an extraordinary situation with ordinary measures," he said.

**Series of rebellions** 

"There have been a series of rebellions across the country," said Francesco Basentini, head of the authority. Video aired on TV showed police and fire trucks outside the prison as black smoke swirled into the sky.

With Italy's economy already on the brink of recession, bars and restaurants in Lombardy were ordered to close or to restrict entry and maintain a distance of at least a metre between people on their premises.

At the weekend, people had queued outside supermarkets to buy food and there was widespread confusion about what exceptions might apply to rules saying people could travel only for proven work reasons or emergencies.

The rules do not stop people going to and from work or prevent goods deliveries, and Switzerland left its border open for the thousands of Italians who commute from Lombardy into the neighbouring Swiss canton of Ticino every day.

# Booker endorses Biden ahead of key primaries

Earlier, former V-P got Harris's backing

Democratic presidential contender Joe Biden, who is seeking to deliver a knockout blow to rival Bernie Sanders on Tuesday as six States vote, received another boost on Monday when former presidential hopeful Cory Booker endorsed his campaign. The Senator from New Jersey, who ended his own White House bid in January, tweeted that Mr. Biden would "restore honor to the Oval Office."

Mr. Booker's endorse ment - one day after another onetime candidate, Senator Kamala Harris of California, did likewise means Mr. Biden has picked up the backing of two black former presidential contenders as he seeks the party's nomination to take on Republican President Donald Trump this fall.

Mr. Biden over the past nine days has powered to the front of the contest for

the Democratic nomination to take on Republican President Donald Trump on November 3. A wave of endorsements by his former rivals has made him the clear standard-bearer for the Democratic Party's moderate wing, while Mr. Sanders represents the party's more liberal elements.

A win in the Midwestern "rust belt" State could give the former Vice-President an insurmountable lead in the number of delegates needed to win the nomination at the party's July

## **New York Port Authority** chief tests positive

The number of confirmed U.S. cases of COVID-19 on Monday rose to 566, including 22 deaths, according to state public health authorities and a running national tally kept by the Johns Hopkins University.

About three-fourths of the 50 U.S. states have reported infections of the respiratory illness COVID-19 that can lead to pneumonia.

The number of people who have tested positive across New York state in-

creased to 142, up from 105 a day earlier, Governor Andrew Cuomo said on Monday. Most of the cases are in Westchester county, where a Manhattan lawyer believed to be at the centre of the outbreak there resides, he told a news conference.

Rick Cotton, executive director of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey which controls airports and other major travel hubs, has tested positive for the virus and will be quarantined and working from home, Mr. Cuomo added.

# <sub>+</sub> Rival Afghan leaders take parallel oaths

At least two blasts hit Ashraf Ghani's oath ceremony, no casualties were reported

Afghanistan lurched deeper into political crisis Monday as the country's two rival leaders swore themselves in as President at simultaneous ceremonies that were interrupted by at least two blasts. The bitter feud between

President Ashraf Ghani and his former Chief Executive Abdullah Abdullah has raised fears for Afghanistan's fragile democracy as the U.S. prepares to leave the country following an agreement last month with a strong and largely unified Taliban.

Polls were held in September, but repeated delays and accusations of voter fraud meant that Mr. Ghani, the incumbent President, was only declared as winner of a second term in February -

from Mr. Abdullah, who vowed to form his own parallel government.

On Monday, Mr. Ghani, dressed in traditional Afghan clothing and white turban, arrived at the presidential palace to be sworn in, sur-

sparking a furious response rounded by supporters, senior political figures, diplomats and foreign dignitaries, including U.S. special envoy Zalmay Khalilzad.

Minutes later, in another corner of the sprawling presidential palace compound, a suit-clad Mr. Abdullah inaugurated himself as President, vowing to "safeguard the independence, national sovereignty, territorial integrity" of Afghanistan.

### Two explosions

As hundreds of people watched Mr. Ghani's ceremony, two loud explosions were heard, prompting some people to flee.

There were no reports of casualties from the blasts, which mirrored a similar incident in August 2018 when militants fired several mortars as Mr. Ghani was making a speech at the palace, injuring six civilians.

"I have no bulletproof vest on, only my shirt," Mr. Ghani told those who stayed behind as sirens wailed. "I will stay even if I have to sacrifice

### U.S. airlines to force Boeing to rewire jets

U.S. aviation regulators plan to require Boeing to rewire all 737 MAX aircraft before allowing the troubled planes fly again, The Wall Street Journal has reported.

Regulators have concluded that the current wiring layout violated safety standards to prevent short-circuits that could cause sharp drops in aircraft pitch similar to what happened in the case of an Ethiopian Airlines flight last year, the newspaper said on Sunday.

The order to modify the wiring would apply to the nearly 800 MAX plans already produced, according to the report.

# Sudan PM survives assassination attempt

Hamdok heads a transitional govt.

Sudanese Prime Minister Abdalla Hamdok survived an assassination attempt targeting his convoy as he headed to work on Monday morning in the capital Khartoum, officials said.

Mr. Hamdok said he was in "good shape" and that what had happened would be "an additional push to the wheel of change in Sudan", where he heads a transitional government following the overthrow last year of long-time President Omar al-Bashir.

Three witnesses said the attack happened near the northern entrance to the Kober bridge, which crosses the Blue Nile from Khar-

toum North to the city centre, where Mr. Hamdok's office is located.

The convoy appeared to have been targeted from above, they said. State radio said it had been hit by gunfire and a projectile, while state television said it had been targeted by a car



### In praise of mothers

The Jain work Naaladiyaar gives motherhood as an example while talking of the importance of having the support of one's family. It says a man who is surrounded by his relatives in troubled times will feel his weakness disappearing. In the same way, when her child is placed on a mother's lap, she forgets the discomforts of pregnancy and the labour pains. The only feeling she experiences is joy. All else is forgotten, said Malayaman in a discourse. Tamil literature has verses that capture the beauty of a mother showing the child the moon and getting it to eat up its food, the child's first attempts at walking and so on. She is patient; she is a woman with good qualities; she is generous; she forgives those who treat her badly; she is honest. Such a woman is a mother to everyone, says Yelaadi.

Naanmanikkadikai says that no relative of a person can compare with his or her mother. Just as one's mother deserves one's gratitude, so too does one's father. Achara kovai says it is the duty of every person to pay respects to his mother and father every day. Thirikadukam says a person has three important duties - studying, living a virtuous life and worshipping his parents.
