# Virus toll soars in Italy; U.S. cases double

Deaths rise by a quarter to 631 in Italy; New York deploys National Guard as the situation worsens

Italians braced for a second day of national lockdown on Wednesday after a sharp spike in coronavirus-related deaths, as New York deployed the National Guard to contain a disease that has sown worldwide panic.

hardest-hit Europe's country said the death toll from COVID-19 had risen on Tuesday by a third to 631, with the surging epidemic playing havoc with global sporting, cultural and political events.

While authorities in China, where the outbreak began, have declared it "basically curbed", cases are multiplying around the world, sparking panic buying in shops, and wild swings on financial markets.

Its seemingly relentless march has now claimed its first victim in Central America, with a 64-year-old man dying in Panama on Tuesday. Indonesia also reported its first death.

China remains the hardest-hit overall with more than 80,000 cases and

3,000 deaths, out of a global total of 1,17,339 cases and 4,251 fatalities in 107 countries and territories, according to an AFP tally.

Beijing reported an increase in imported cases Wednesday.

Nevertheless, some companies in Wuhan, the Chinese city where the virus emerged late last year, are to be allowed to return to work. Coronavirus is infecting all walks of life, including politics, with U.S. Democratic presidential hopefuls Bernie Sanders and Joe Biden both cancelling rallies.

And amid criticism of the U.S. authorities' response, New York deployed the National Guard for the first time during the crisis to help contain the spread of the disease from an infection-hit suburb.

### 70% of Germans at risk: Merkel

# Weinstein sentenced to 23 years in jail for rape, assault

Over 100 women had accused him of predatory behaviour

Former movie producer Harvey Weinstein was sentenced on Wednesday to 23 years in prison for sexual assault and rape after giving a rambling court statement sympathising with men accused of sexual misconduct during the #MeToo era.

The sentence was handed down in Manhattan criminal court by Justice James Burke, who presided over Weinstein's trial. A jury on February 24 found Weinstein, 67, guilty of sexually assaulting a former production assistant and raping a former aspiring actress.

"I feel remorse for all of the men who are going through this fight," Weinstein told the court before he was sentenced, sounding unrepentant.

Weinstein said he was worried about the "thousands of men who are losing due process" during the #MeToo movement just as people in the past had their

careers destroyed when they were accused of being communists. "I think that's what's happening now all over this country," he said.

During the sentencing hearing, prosecutor Joan Illuzzi asked Justice Burke to impose 25 years or "near" 25 years in prison for his conviction on a charge of criminal sexual act in the first deinvolving production assistant and to impose a consecutive sentence for the third-degree rape conviction involving the aspiring actress.

In an emotional state-

ment in court, one of the victims spoke of the trauma she had endured since the attack, saying, "It scarred me deeply, mentally and emotionally, perhaps irreparably, perhaps forever."

Prosecutors in court filings last week said the sentence should reflect not only the crimes of which he was convicted, but a "lifetime of abuse towards others.'

More than 100 women, including famous actresses. have accused Weinstein of sexual misconduct stretching back decades, fueling the #MeToo movement against sexual abuse and harassment.

The jury of seven men and five women acquitted Weinstein on the most serious charges, a single count of first-degree rape as well as two counts of predatory sexual assault, which carried a potential life sentence. Those charges relied on testimony by another actress, who said Weinstein raped her in the early 1990s.

## Sri Lanka calls for cooperation after tourist guide gets infected

Sri Lanka on Wednesday urged the public to cooperate with the government to prevent the spread of CO-VID-19 in the island nation, after a local tourist guide tested positive for the new coronavirus.

The 52-year-old tourist guide was on Tuesday found to be the first Sri Lankan to be infected by the virus, according to the Director Gen-

eral of Health Dr. Anil Jasinghe. The patient has been sent to the infectious diseases hospital, a press release from the President's Media Division said.

Authorities are checking on the people who may have come into contact with the patient.

Earlier, a Chinese tourist visiting Sri Lanka tested positive for COVID 19, and she

returned to China in February, following treatment in quarantine.

Further, from Tuesday onwards, the Sri Lankan government has enforced mandatory quarantine of all passengers arriving from countries, including Iran, Italy and South Korea.

Meanwhile, the Government Information Department has said that Sri Lanka has suspended visa on arrival until further notice.

## Parliament passes amendment allowing Putin to stay in power

Constitutional changes allowing Vladimir Putin to run for President again in 2024 sailed through Russia's lower house of Parliament on Wednesday, opening the way for him to potentially stay in power until 2036.

Mr. Putin, a former KGB officer, is currently required by the Constitution to step down in 2024 when his second sequential and fourth

presidential term ends. But the amendment would formally reset his presidential term tally to zero.

The 450-seat State Duma, the lower house of Parliament, on Wednesday voted in favour of the change, along with other amendments to the Constitution, by 383 votes. Nobody voted against, but 43 lawmakers abstained. Twenty-four lawmakers were absent.

If, as Mr. Putin critics ex-

pect, the constitutional court now gives its blessing to the amendment and it is backed in a nationwide vote on April 22, Mr. Putin would have the option to run again for President in 2024.

Kremlin critic and opposition politician Alexei Navalny has said he believes Mr. Putin will now try to become President for life.

## + Biden widens lead over Sanders with wins

Former Vice-President takes four States in primaries, appeals for unity in party

If 'Super Tuesday' last week ders's continuation in the made former U.S. Vice-President Joseph R. Biden Jr. the frontrunner in the Democratic primaries, then this Tuesday confirmed it in a big way with wins in four States, with support from African American, suburban and rural voters.

The biggest prize for the night was Mr. Biden's decisive victory against his opponent, progressive candidate Senator Bernie Sanders, in Michigan – a State Donald Trump had flipped in 2016 from Democrats and which Mr. Sanders himself had won in the primary that year against Hilary Clinton. While

there were questions on Tuesday night about Mr. Sanprimaries, the Vermont Senator announced on Wednesday afternoon that he would stay in the race and debate Mr. Biden on Sunday.

Mr. Sanders won North Dakota and led in the second most delegate rich State for the night - Washington. With delegates still being counted, Mr. Sanders had won a total of 110 on Tuesday (684 cumulatively), but that was still not enough to keep up with Mr. Biden's 176 (846 cumulatively).

Mr. Biden's won by huge margins among African American voters across States – for instance, 87% in



Mississippi versus Mr. Sanders's 10% in that State, as per exit polls conducted by Edison Media Research and analysed by the Washington *Post.* However, he also won the white vote – by narrower margins – in Michigan, Missouri and Mississippi.

In Michigan, Mr. Biden won the African American vote by 53% against Mr. San-

Mr. Sanders won among Latinos and younger people - those under 45, and he won strongly in the 18-29 age group.

> Mr. Sanders was the leading candidate at the end of February after coming second in Iowa in terms of delegates, first in Nevada by a large margin and tied for delegates with former candidate and Southbend Mayor Pete Buttigieg. Mr. Biden's crucial February 29 victory in South Carolina, which hinged on support from African Americans brought the former Vice-President back into the race and gave him the momentum to go into Super Tuesday (March 3). Also crucial to his performance last Tuesday was getting endorsed by former rivals, Mr. Buttigieg and Minnesota Senator Amy Klobuchar, who dropped out of the race.

## Myanmar Army blocks bid to limit their power base

Suu Kyi's path to presidency blocked

NAYPYIDAW Myanmar's military Tuesday quashed proposals in Parliament that would mean its MPs relinquish power, in a vote pitting the armed forces in open opposition against Aung San Suu

Kyi as elections loom. The vote was the climax of a year of fierce debates between MPs as the civilian government attempted to reform the Constitution and reduce the military's stranglehold on Parliament.

The country is gearing up to polls likely to be held later this year, only the second since outright military rule

But the military still wields considerable power, appointing three key Ministers – defence, border and home affairs

Crucially, it holds a quarter of parliamentary seats, effectively giving it a veto over any legislation. The Parliament also re-

jected a proposed constitutional amendment that would have allowed the country's de facto leader, Ms. Suu Kyi, to officially become President.

Article 59(f) of the constitution bars a person from becoming President if his or her spouse or children are foreign citizens. Her two sons are British nationals, as was her late husband.



Taliban rejects offer to free 1,500 prisoners





## The names of Vishnu

The 59th name of Lord Mahavishnu in the Vishnu Sahasranama is LohitAksha. Parasara Bhatta, who wrote a commentary for the Vishnu Sahasranama, says the Lord is always happy because of His many leelas. And because of this joy, His eyes are red like lotuses. Hence the name LohitAskha (lohita - red in colour; aksha - eyes). Singing of the beauty of Lord Ranganatha of Srirangam, Thirupannazhvar talks of the beautiful red lines in Ranganatha's eyes.

The Lord is joyful, because He showers His devotees with His daya. This leads us to name number 138 in Parasara Bhatta's classification. The 138th name is krtAkrtah. This means that He is the giver of everything. He gives worldly joys and moksha, explained V.S. Karunakarachariar in a discourse. Worldly joys are artificial (krta). It is in the nature of the atma to seek proximity to the Supreme One. So, to seek moksha is natural (akrta). But since we crave worldly joys, He gives us these too. Since He gives us krta and akrta, He is krtAkrtah. Doing a japa of this name will bring us moksha.

Vishnu is also called ajah. It means He is not born like us. While we cannot choose our parents, the time of our birth or the form we will take, the Lord decides the place, time and manner of His birth. Particularly interesting is His Narasimha avatara. The name ajah occurs twice in the Vishnu Sahasranama. Name 206 - ajah - is explained by Parasara Bhatta with reference to the Narasimha avatara. He says that since Narasimha was born from a pillar, His arrival was most unusual! The 737th name is 'tat.' This is explained by Parasara Bhatta as 'He who expands, or magnifies.' What does He magnify? If we take one step towards Him, He multiplies that a hundredfold, and counts that one little step as hundred steps towards Him.
