Reading of Faiz poem 'unsuitable to time, place': IIT-K panel

THE RECITATION of Faiz Ahmad Faiz's poem by students protesting against the Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA) on campus last year was "unsuitable to the time and place", a committee set up by the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) in Kanpur has concluded.

five teachers and six students, who participated in the protest, "to be less than desirable" and recommended that the institute should "counsel" them.

The six-member committee was set up by the institute to look into a complaint against a students' demonstration on December 17, where Faiz's poem, 'Hum Dekhenge', was read to express solidarity with students of Jamia Millia Islamia, who were beaten up by Delhi Police during a protest against the amended citizenship law.

The complaint by Vashi Mant Sharma, a temporary teacher at IIT-Kanpur, claimed the poem hurts his religious sentiments. The complaint was provoked by the reading of two lines from the poem: "Jab arz-e-Khuda ke Ka'abe se, sab buutt uthwaae jaayenge/ Hum ahl-e-safa mardood-e-haram, masnad pe bithaaye jaayenge/ Sab taaj uchhale jaayenge, sab takht giraaye *jaayenge*", roughly translated as, "From the abode of God, when the icons of falsehood will be removed/ When we, the faithful, who have been barred from

SAARC leaders discuss virus fightback plan, India proposes emergency fund

Pak raises J&K, says 'lockdown must be lifted immediately'

IN AN unprecedented initiative, as SAARC leaders held a summit via video-conference to discuss the way forward to fight the coronavirus pandemic, India on Sunday proposed creation of a COVID-19 emergency fund, for which it committed "an initial offer of US\$ 10 million".

Highest single-day jump in new cases, over 450 airlifted from Iran and Italy

ABANTIKA GHOSH NEW DELHI, MARCH 15

WITH 26 NEW novel coronavirus (COVID-19) cases being reported on Sunday — the biggest single-day rise so far the total number of positive cases jumped to 110, including 17 foreign nationals.

While 13 people have recov-

ered, two have died. Of the new was admitted to a private hospicases, 18 were reported from Maharashtra, 2 from Telangana, 3 from Kerala and 1 each from Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand. At 32, Maharashtra has now overtaken Kerala (22) as the state with the highest number of cases.

The health ministry clarified that a 71-year-old man from Maharashtra's Buldhana, who tal and died on Saturday, tested negative for coronavirus infection. He had returned from Saudi Arabia recently and had diabetes and high blood pressure.

With the World Health Organisation (WHO) declaring COVID-19 a pandemic, over 4,000 people who had come in contact with the positive cases have been

MP Speaker defiant on floor test, says virus bigger worry

MILIND GHATWAI BHOPAL, MARCH 15

WITH THE Madhya Pradesh Assembly Speaker striking a defiant note, there was no clarity if the floor test ordered by the Governor would take place on Monday, the first day of the Budget Session of the Madhya Pradesh Assembly, even as the fate of the 15-month-old Kamal Nath-led Congress government hung in the balance.

In a late night letter to Chief Minister Kamal Nath on Saturday, Governor Lalji Tandon

had said that prima facie he was convinced that the Congress government was in minority and to "protect democratic principles", Nath must win the trust of the House immediately after the Governor's address on Monday. "The proceedings will begin on Monday and in every circumstance will not be cancelled, delayed or suspended," the Governor said while asking that voting should be by division, not **CONTINUED ON PAGE 2**

Gujarat: 4 Cong MLAs resign ahead of RS polls, 41 sent to Jaipur resort

FOUR GUJARAT Congress MLAs tendered their resignation to the Assembly Speaker on Saturday, triggering panic in the party ahead of the March 26 election to four Rajya Sabha seats from the state. One more MLA was reported to have gone "unreachable" since Sunday morning, leading to speculation that he

too has joined the rebels. Speaking to The Indian Express, Speaker Rajendra Trivedi con-

firmed that he had accepted the resignations of four MLAs of the Opposition party. Trivedi, however, refused to share their names, saying he would do so only in the House.

According to sources, the four MLAs who resigned are Soma Patel from Surendranagar, J V Kakadiya from Dhari, Mangal Gavit from Dang and Pradhyumansinh Jadeja from Abdasa.

Sources in the Congress said they were suspicious when Mangal Gavit, a two-time Congress MLA from Dang in South Gujarat, left Gandhinagar for Dang during the ongoing

A 57-YEAR-OLD UK national, who tested positive but fled quarantine at a resort in Munnar, was offloaded from a Dubaibound flight at Kochi airport on Sunday. The man's wife and 17 others who were part of the

tourist group were offloaded too.

While the UK national and his wife have been admitted to an isolation facility at a government hospital, the 17 others from his group have been sent to a hotel for quarantine. Another passenger voluntarily opted not to travel and has been advised home quarantine, officials said.
