Experts who have been crunching the numbers note that India needs a better system of data collection and reporting if it wants to effect the collection of the collection and pandemic. They noted that due to the wildly different practices employed by various local government bodies, states and the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) at the Centre, the published data comes with a lot of caveats.






